

Please join us as we host 2 screenings of the forever, quintessential American film classic. This film only gets better with age, so treat yourself and the entire family to the joy of watching Donna and Jimmy Stewart together on the big screen.

Donna Reed was born Donna Belle Mullenger on a farm just outside of Denison, Iowa. At the age of 16 she left Denison by train, for Los Angeles, to attend college and pursue her dream of becoming an actress.



Her dream became a reality as she captivated the country with her sensitive portrayals in such films as Frank Capra's It's a Wonderful Life and John Ford's They Were Expendable. Donna appeared in over forty feature films with many of Hollywood's greatest stars and directors. In 1954 she won the coveted Oscar for her role as Alma in From Here to Eternity. Donna is perhaps best remembered for her work in the television series The Donna Reed Show which aired on ABC from 1958 through 1966. She played the "prettiest and most together TV mothers of the family obsessed 1950's".

In spite of the fame and success she found in Hollywood, Donna never forgot her roots in Iowa. She was proud of being a farm girl and returned to Denison often throughout her career. Following her death in 1986, her Oscar was bequeathed to the City of Denison and is displayed at the historic McHenry House.

The Donna Reed Foundation for the Performing Arts was created honor Donna's memory, her accomplishments and to keep her dream alive by recognizing, encouraging and supporting talented individuals to pursue their education and careers in the performing arts. The Foundation sponsors weekend workshops, live concerts, and cultural performances throughout the year.

The Donna Reed Center for the Performing Arts sits on the historic corner of Broadway and Main in Denison, Iowa. The Center houses the Donna Reed Foundation headquarters, a charming turn-of-the-century soda fountain, and the Donna Reed Theatre. When completed, the Center will include the Donna Reed Museum and will also offer unique workshops and performances year round.
